History & Purpose Leadership Plano began in 1983 as a community leadership development program of the Plano Chamber of Commerce. Each year, up to 36 candidates are selected to participate in the program. Leadership Plano is dedicated to educating, developing, and empowering current and future leaders for the community and motivating them to serve civic, charitable, and business organizations.



Participants Plano is synonymous with excellence, and our leadership has reflected this fact. Through Leadership Plano, the Plano Chamber of Commerce is committed to continuing the strong tradition of involved, dedicated community leadership that has served the city so well. Leadership Plano participants are given the opportunity to explore the inner workings of Plano's government, educational systems, private and non-profit organizations, justice system, and economic development. The insight they gain is meant to serve as the foundation for their long-term involvement in the Plano community, ideally in a variety of leadership roles. The individuals profiled in this book were selected
